Students will not be permitted to wear leggings or sports jumpers or hoodies, if these are in school, students will be expected to remove them, and they will be given an alternative item of the school uniform for the day. All students are expected to wear a blazer and a tie, if you have any issues with accessing any of our school uniform, please contact your child's Head of Year and we will be able to offer support.

Ensuring good attendance is crucial for your child's academic success, it ensures they don't miss crucial learning points in lessons as teachers move through the curriculum; each lesson builds on the one before and without this, students unfortunately have gaps in their learning. Promoting positive attendance is a shared responsibility and your support plays a significant role in achieving this. If your child is unwell and can't attend school, please make sure you notify school the same day. You will also find guidance on promoting positive attendance on our school website, this also details our approach to taking holidays during term time. I have included the updated guidance on penalty notice fines from Sheffield, the new system for penalty notices comes into force after 19th August 2024.

If there are any challenges or concerns affecting your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to contact our Attendance Manager, Mrs Parker, or your child's Head of Year. We are here to assist and work collaboratively with you to find solutions that support your child's education.

We always want to ensure our students feel comfortable in school, and to remain active in lessons to ensure they are engaging with their learning. Students will not be given permission to leave lessons for the toilet during learning time unless it is an emergency or there is a medical reason. This is to support teaching and learning and



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ensure all our students have the best lesson experience each, and every day. All our students have access to the toilets before the school day, at break, at lunch, between all five lessons during the day and again at the end of the day. We feel this gives ample opportunities for the toilet and would welcome the support of parents to promote this with your children. If there are evidenced-based medical reasons, then of course, we would support with a toilet pass.

We are currently in the process of reviewing all our passes in school and will be working with students and parents to ensure these are used in the right way, by the right students. I would like to thank you for your support in this matter.

Students will return to school on Monday 15th April, at the usual time.

I will keep you updated throughout the final term as to our plans, events, and celebrations.

I will ensure we maintain the very highest of expectations for all our children at Handsworth Grange and build on this at every opportunity.
