This is marked by class teachers and feedback given. | Three main assessment points a year-a baseline test at the beginning of the year, a mid year assessment and a final assessment at the end of the year. All pupils will be given a personalised analysis of their strengths and weaknesses from the all three assessments. The final assessment will be used to reflect upon which tier pupils will sit at the end of Y11 |
| Y11 | Homework booklet given once per half term on previous half terms learning. These are marked by class teachers and feedback given. Extra revision homework given based on area pupils may need to work on | Pupils self mark most class work. Books are then marked by teachers and feedback given. Pupils sit regular practice papers in lesson-at least one every two weeks. This is marked by class teachers and feedback given. | Two mock exam assessment points- November and March. From these assessments, pupils will receive personalised feedback on their strengths and areas of development. Final GCSE assessment in May/June. Pupils will sit three maths paper-the first non- |
